SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Amended July 8 to remove divisions.

1 RULES

- 1.1 The regatta will be governed by the rules as defined in [The Racing Rules of Sailing 2021-2024](#), subject to alteration by [PHRF-BC](#), the sailing instructions and notification from the race committee.
- 1.2 All boats must comply with the Safety Requirements as set out in section 1.5 of the [2021 VARC Notice of Race](#).
- 1.3 Rule 52 is modified to allow boats racing single-handed to use autopilot or tiller-pilot.

2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 0900 on the day it will take effect.

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

- 4.1 No signals will be made ashore.

5 SCHEDULE OF RACES

- 5.1 Dates of racing:
July 17, 2021
- 5.2 The scheduled time of the first warning signal is 1100.
- 5.3 There will be no starts after 1300.

6 CLASSES and CLASS FLAGS

- 6.1 There will be one division for all single and double handed boats.
- 6.2 No Flying Sails. Boats rated for spinnaker but wish to race no flying sails shall make this clear to the race committee at check-in.
- 6.2.1 The no flying sails allowance will be based on rule 15.7 found [here](#), unless the Fleet Captain deems a different allowance is appropriate. Competitors are *required* to report their current PHRF Certificate Jib Code to race committee at check in. Boats failing to do so, or without a valid certificate will be scored with an NFS allowance of 12 seconds.

7 RACING AREAS

- 7.1 Races will start in the southeast area of English Bay, generally west of the Kits Barge Buoy.

8 THE COURSE

- 8.1 From the start/finish line round Passage Island, in either direction (to Port or to Starboard) and return to the start/finish line.
- 8.2 The course will not be shortened.

9 MARKS

- 9.1** The starting and finishing marks will be an orange flag on the committee boat and an orange flag on a floating staff. There will be no other marks.

10 AREAS THAT ARE OBSTRUCTIONS

The following areas are designated as obstructions: A line extending from the northwest corner of the RCYC breakwater to the line beginning with the northwest corner of the RVYC Jericho breakwater, joining adjacent permanent red can buoys, and ending with the north end of the most westerly pier at Jericho Sailing Centre, shall be an obstruction. The Red marker buoys and the line both rank as obstructions. Boats sailing into the obstruction area shall be subject to protest and disqualification. **DO NOT INDENT THE LINE.**

11 THE START

- 11.1** Races will be started by using rule 26 with the warning signal made 5 minutes before the starting signal.
- 11.2** There will be one start.
- 11.3** The starting line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the starting mark and a staff displaying an orange flag on the committee boat.
- 11.4** A boat starting later than 5 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes rule A4.

12 THE FINISH

- 12.1** The finish line will be between a staff displaying an orange flag on the starting mark and a staff displaying an orange flag on the committee boat.
- 12.2** Kiss of the Frog: If it becomes obvious that one boat will place last, with no opportunity of improving her position, the race committee may give her a last place finish without requiring her to cross the finish line.
- 12.2.1** The race committee will sound three horns, raise the Kiss of the Frog flag, and attempt to hail the boat on VHF channel 68.

13 TIMING AND TIME LIMITS

- 13.1** The time limit for all divisions will be 1630 hours. If one or more boats in a division finish within the time limit, the time limit for all divisions will be extended 30 minutes.
- 13.2** Boats failing to finish within time limit will be scored Did Not Finish without a hearing.

14 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

- 14.1** Protest forms are available at [ISAF](#). Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered to the [Fleet Captain](#) within the time limit.
- 14.2** For each class, the protest time limit is 3 hours after the last boat has finished the last race of the day or the race committee signals no more racing today, whichever is later.
- 14.3** Notices of protests will be emailed to the involved parties and all parties will be informed of the time and place of the hearing when available.

15 SCORING

- 15.1** 1 race is required to be completed to constitute a regatta.

16 SAFETY REGULATIONS

- 16.1** Check-In: All boats must check in on VHF channel 68 or coming within hail of the race committee boat and giving boat name, sail number and division.
- 16.2** A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.

16.3 Short-Handed Racers: Any participant sailing single or double-handed must always wear their PFD. A harness, tether, and jack-lines are strongly encouraged.

17 EQUIPMENT AND MEASUREMENT CHECKS

A boat or equipment may be inspected at any time for compliance with the class rules and sailing instructions. On the water, a boat can be instructed by a race committee equipment inspector or measurer to proceed immediately to a designated area for inspection.

18 OFFICIAL BOATS

Official boats may be marked by flying a large TCYC burgee.

19 RADIO COMMUNICATION

Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones.

20 PRIZES

Due to the current restrictions, there will be no post-race prize giving. We are currently working with our sponsors to come up with some sort of prize structure. Thank you for your patience and understanding.

21 DISCLAIMERS OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the regatta entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury, or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the regatta.

22 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance with a minimum cover of \$1,000,000 per incident or the equivalent.
